Health and Safety Code § 117555

Solid waste, in or upon a street, alley, public highway, or road in common use or upon a public park or other public property, or upon private property

without the owner's consent =

GUILTY of MISDEMEANOR.

ILLEGAL DUMPING ON PUBLIC ROADWAY/ RIGHT OF WAY

Health and Safety Code § 117555

Not applicable to private property unless:

- Public health and safety hazard
- Public Nuisance
- Fire hazard

WASTE MATTER – Defined Public Resources Code § 40191(a)

"Solid waste" means all putrescible and non-putrescible solid, semisolid, and liquid wastes including garbage, trash, refuse, paper, rubbish, ashes, industrial wastes, demolition and construction wastes, abandoned vehicles and parts thereof, discarded home and industrial appliances, dewatered, treated, or chemically fixed sewage sludge which is not hazardous waste, manure, vegetable or animal solid and semisolid wastes, and other discarded solid and semisolid wastes.

WASTE MATTER – Defined Public Resources Code § 40191(b)

Solid Waste Does NOT Include:

Hazardous Waste Radioactive Waste Medical Waste

Solid Waste Does Not Include "Littering" as Defined in Penal Code § 374.4 = "Small quantities"

CALIFORNIA DUMPING STATUTE

Penal Code § 374.3

It is unlawful to dump or cause to be dumped waste matter:

- Private highway road
- Public highway road
- Portion of right of way
- Private property
 - no permission or public health/safety hazard,
 public nuisance, or fire hazard
- Public property

NON-COMMERCIAL QUANTITY = INFRACTION Only

- Use for Non-commercial waste PC 374.3(a)

- PENALTY Non-commercial Quantity PC 374.3(c)
 - FINE: 1^{ST} Offense = \$250-\$1,000
 - FINE: 2^{nd} Offense = \$500-\$1,500
 - FINE: 3^{RD} Offense = \$750-\$3,000
- Tires
 - FINE: Doubled
- Cost of Clean-up/Removal

CALIFORNIA DUMPING STATUTE

Penal Code § 374.3

• Commercial Waste Dumping – PC 374.3(h)(1) Commercial quantities = Misdemeanor

- Commercial waste dumping PC 374.3(h)(2)
 Commercial quantities =
 In excess of one cubic yard
- Does not apply to household waste at residence

CALIFORNIA DUMPING STATUTE

Penal Code § 374.3

- PENALTY Commercial waste PC 374.3(h)(1)
 - Up to 6 Months County Jail
 - FINE: 1^{ST} Offense = \$1,000-\$3,000
 - FINE: 2^{nd} Offense = \$3,000-\$6,000
 - FINE: 3^{RD} Offense = \$6,000-\$10,000
- PENALTY Commercial waste PC 374.3(g)
 - Minimum = 12 hours community service picking up waste matter

TRESPASSED LAND Owner - no permission PC 374.3

ISSUE – NO PC 374.3 When Owner gives permission!!

GRADING VOLUME CALCULATIONS Canyon Road,

The following is the grading calculation report from the on-site inspection February 3rd, 2020 and May 28th, 2020 by Mr. Joshua Lugavere P.E. Engineering Assistant. Mr. Lugavere is a part of the Los Angeles Count Drainage and Grading Section and is assigned to the Calabasas Dist calculations are based on on-site field observations and measurements vinstruments.

Grading Inspection on February 3rd, 2020


This is the Building and Safety, Drainage and Grading Section's estima yards moved at Canyon Road which is valid up until the visit on February 3, 2020.

The north portion of the disturbed area was cut to develop a pad wher placed and was being used for vehicle storage at the time of the site visit With a range finder Public Works measured the vertical and horizontal cor the 99.5' length of the cut slope. The minimum value of 6' vertical and 35' measured to natural grade. The vertical and horizontal components of the rounded down to the nearest 5' interval, and the length of the slope was to the nearest 10' increment for a conservative estimate. The volume of cl (CY) was measured using a triangular prism (see below) formula resulting

The south portion of the disturbed area was filled to create an approxin from the aforementioned pad to existing grade at the time of the site finder Public Works measured the vertical and horizontal compone length of the fill slope. The minimum value of 21' vertical and easured to natural grade. The vertical and horizontal components or ounded down to the nearest 5' interval, and the length of the slope to the nearest 20' increment for a conservative estimate. The volume (CY) was measured using a triangular prism (see below) formula rest.




The total CY of cut & fill is therefore conservatively estimated to be CY. To air on the side of caution, I believe Public Works can comforta 5,750 cubic yards.

Grading Inspection on May 28th, 2020


Originally the north portion of the disturbed area was filled to develop a pad where concrete was placed and was being used for vehicle storage at the time of the first visit. That pad appears to have been extended from the original face of the slope (approx. 2:1 H:V) that was observed on February 3, 2020. With a range finder Public Works measured the vertical and horizontal components along the new fill slope shown below, which was not present during the visit in February.



A length of 85' and height of 16' were measured for the new aforementioned portion of fill. Based on our previous field visit, the new fill slope extended approximately 15' beyond the face of the original fill slope. Dimensions of 75' in length, 12' in height, and an extension of 10' were used for a conservative estimate. The volume of fill in cubic yards (CY) was measured using a right-angle tetrahedron volume formula. The new fill slope was modeled using four component tetrahedrons. The volume calculations were subsequently rounded down to the nearest 5 CY interval, resulting in a conservative estimate of 110 cubic yards of new fill (see below).



The piles were measured in two sections that could be modeled as cones for volume calculations. The first pile measured 9.5' high with a minimum diameter of 28'. The second smaller pile measured 5' high with a minimum diameter of 12'. Using a conic formula, the fill volume of the piles were conservatively estimated and rounded down to the nearest 5 CY interval. This yielded a conservative volume of 70 CYS of fill for the larger pile, and 5 CYs of fill for the smaller pile.



Therefore, the total conservatively estimated unpermitted grading for this site between February 3, 2020 and Public Works' follow up visit on May 28, 2020 is estimated at **1,025 CY**.

CALIFORNIA PENAL CODE:

LOS ANGELES COUNTY BUILDING CODE, TITLE 26, APPENDIX J:

Grading without permit or inspection (50 cubic yards or greater) - Owner or agent

(Charge for property owner that allows unpermitted grading of 50 cubic yards or greater. Note exceptions: charge when less than 50 cubic yards if dumping with a 5 to 1 slope or when dumping in a drainage course. Consult with Department of Public Works (DPW).)

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO Penal Code § 374.3

California Penal Code section 374.3(d):

EXPAND STATE/LOCAL AGENCIES AUTHORIZED TO DECLARE A PROPERTY A NUISANCE WITH UNLAWFULLY DUMPED WASTE:

Add authority to declare a property with unlawfully dumped waste a public health and safety hazard, public nuisance or a fire hazard to "state or local agency with jurisdiction over the property" plus already authorized local health department, local fire department, district providing fire protection services, and Department of Forestry and Fire Protection.

California Penal Code section 374.3(a), 374.3(b), 374.3(d):

PROPERTY OWNER/AGENT THAT GIVES CONSENT TO DUMP MUST OBTAIN REQUIRED STATE/COUNTY/LOCAL PERMIT/LICENSE *BEFORE* DUMPING:

Property owners or their agents must first obtain required state/county/local permits/licenses <u>before</u> depositing waste on property when consent to dump is given.
